The National Driving Tour is one of the CLC's much-anticipated annual events since its initiation in 1997. The NDT is second only to the Grand National in the club's calendar. An evening stroll along the Arkansas River might be just the ticket. Hike to the "Keeper of the Plains," a 44-foot metal sculpture illuminated every evening by a ring of fire. Baseball fans can enjoy Wichita's Wind Surge minor league team just a short walk from the hotel at Riverfront Stadium. In short, the central plains are yours to discover.

Using Wichita as our hub, we'll depart from our secured, covered parking each morning to reach the day's destinations. Morning drivers' meetings will held in the lobby, under the mezzanine. Here we'll review the day's itinerary. If you haven't brought your Cadillac, now is your chance to hitch a ride. Our longest drive is to Salina, which is 90 miles away. Driving directions are a suggestion, and anticipate a slower, more scenic route. However, plugging the destination into your GPS, and driving an alternative route is certainly permitted.

As your hosts for the 2024 NDT in Kansas, your fellow members in the Missouri Valley, and Central Plains Regions, are excited to welcome you, and help you discover the unique sights and activities this region has to offer. ### **Welcome to Kansas!**

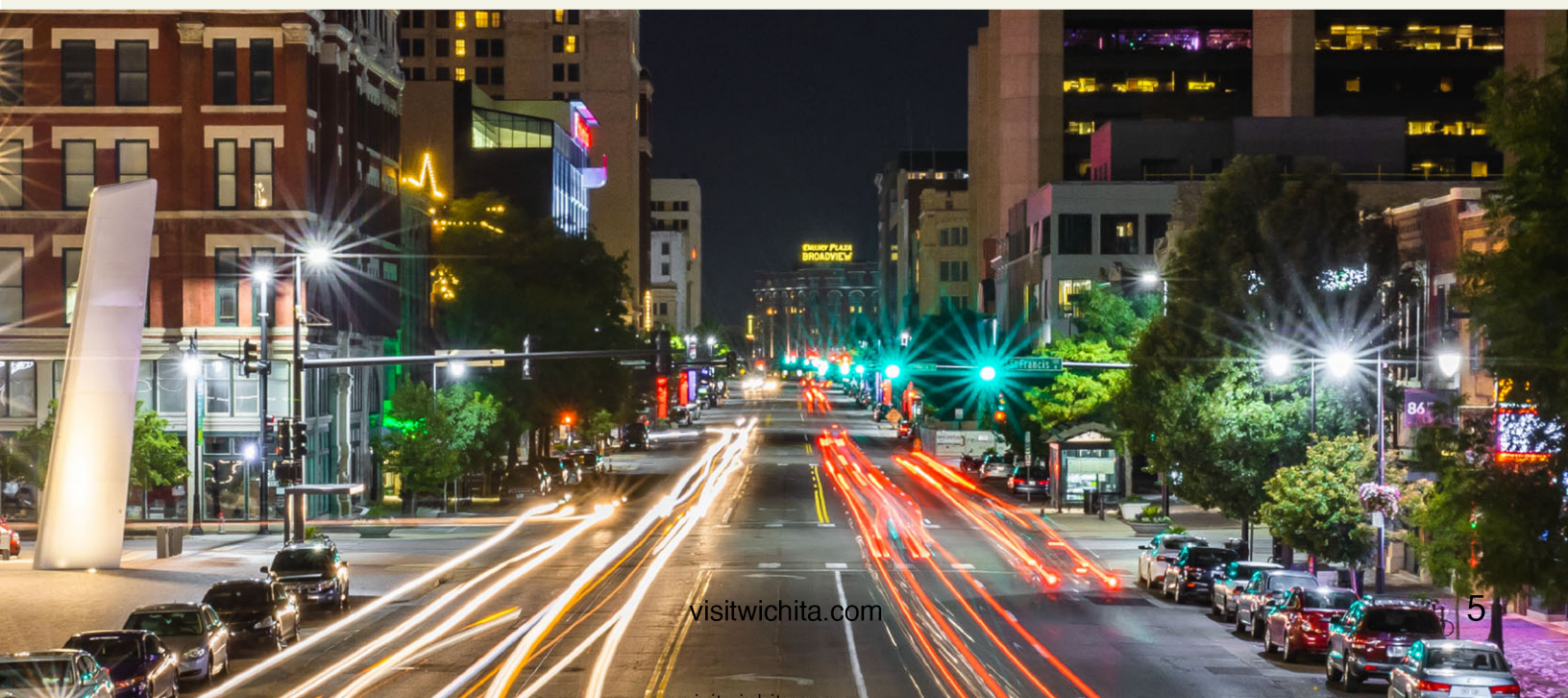

# DRIVING TOUR TIPS AND FAQs

Welcome to the Cadillac & LaSalle Club 2024 National Driving Tour. Get ready for a great time! Here are answers to some FAQs and other useful information:

**Are we all driving together?** The answer is yes... and no. This driving tour is not designed to be run Parade Style. There are too many options, too many miles, and folks will want to stop as needed.

**Do I need to stick with the group?** There is no obligation for anyone to follow the group, however, please respect the arrival times at each destination.

**How does each day begin?** Each morning, the day starts with a drivers' meeting at the host hotel. The drivers' meetings will review the day's plan. If there are changes to the itinerary this will be discussed. If you are not staying at the designated host hotel, please try to attend the drivers' meetings anyway. Please have your breakfast BEFORE the drivers' meetings.

**Are driving directions provided?** General directions are provided, but not guaranteed to be accurate to a 10th of a mile. It is suggested that you have a GPS or GPS phone app with you. If you are without one, someone on the tour will lead the way. If you get lost, please call Tom 816-499-2243

**What if I breakdown?** Please raise your hood, even if your problem is not engine related. If you are on the side of the road with your hood down we will assume you are OK. We will try to offer as much assistance as possible but we are not equipped to do any major repairs. Have your AAA card handy.

**What if someone else breaks down?** If you see a Tour member in distress and there are already one or two other tour cars providing help, you probably shouldn't pull over. Having a clump of classic Cads on the side of the road might be a big hazard. We have not arranged for any roadside services, but we are a resourceful bunch, we can help.

**Snacks and water** will be provided each morning at the drivers' meetings.





# GET TO KNOW WICHITA: AIR CAPITAL

Wichita is the largest city in the state of Kansas and the 48th-largest city in the United States, with a population of more than 389,000. The estimated population of the Wichita metropolitan area is 650,000.

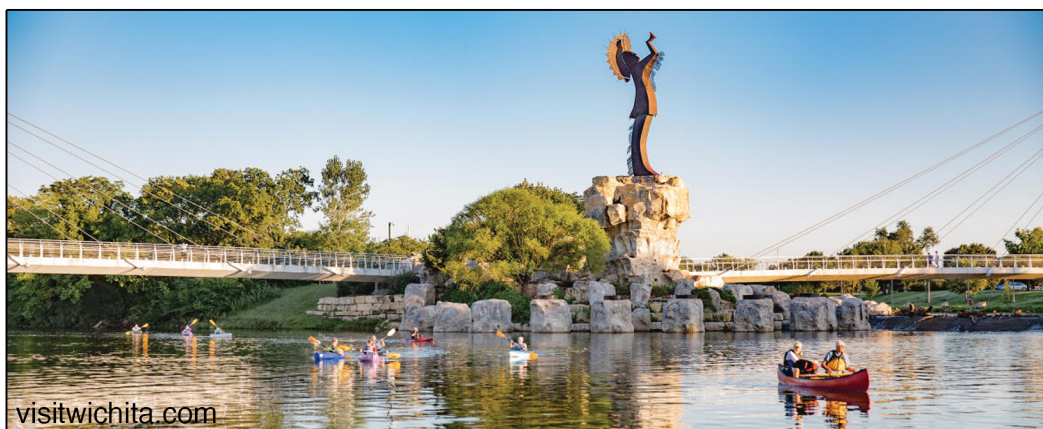
The Wild West gave birth to a new era as cowboys and Indians roamed across the Plains, many establishing towns west of the Mississippi. Wichita was one of those towns, established in 1870 by 123 men and one woman. She happened to be the mother of infamous outlaw Billie the Kid. The city began as a trading post on the Chisholm Trail in the 1860s, and subsequently became a key destination for cattle drives traveling north from Texas to access railroads, earning it the nickname "Cowtown."

In the 1920s and 1930s, businessmen and aeronautical engineers established a number of successful aircraft manufacturing companies in Wichita. Lloyd Stearman, Walter Beech and Clyde Cessna established the Travel Air Manufacturing Company in Wichita in Jan. 26, 1925. The city transformed into a hub of aircraft production and became known as The Air Capital of the World. Beechcraft, Cessna (both now part of Textron Aviation) and other firms including Bombardier Learjet, Airbus and Spirit AeroSystems continue to operate design and manufacturing facilities in Wichita today, and the city remains a major center of the aircraft industry.

Since its early days, Wichita has evolved into a vibrant, multicultural city, with many new restaurants, shops, breweries and outdoor spaces. You may want to visit Naftzger Park a newly redesigned urban park in downtown Wichita. It's a regular gathering spot for food trucks, and Revolutsia, a shipping container development with shopping and dining.

Tired of driving? Public transportation is available in the downtown area. Check out the complementary Q-Line, Bike Share ICT, or the electric scooters.

# WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 28<sup>TH</sup> TOUR DESCRIPTION

Hutchinson - Yoder - Hutchinson

After a one-hour drive, you and your hard-hat equipped companions will descend on a subterranean adventure which will take your 650 below the corn fields. Here you'll find the western hemisphere's only underground salt mine museum. The enormous caverns are 275-million years old. Hop on the Salt Mine Express Train ride which whisks you to exhibits, including hand-on displays, videos and artifacts. While treacherous mining won't be expected of you, you'll see how this dangerous work was once accomplished. Don't worry, we haven't lost a tourist in weeks!

Lunch: You may not have to work like a salt miner, but you can certainly eat like one. Mind the Amish buggies as you drive a short distance away to the Carriage Crossing Restaurant in Yoder. Here your delicious food and pies are served family style.

From the depths of the salt mines, you'll raise your eyes to the stars when we visit the Smithsonian-affiliated Cosmosphere. As you enter the building, don't bump your head on the wing of a SR-71 Blackbird spy plane, or the T-38 astronaut training jet hanging from the ceiling. The Cosmosphere houses the actual Apollo 13 Command Module and a veteran Vostok spacecraft. During the tour you'll discover the most significant collection of US and Russian space artifacts in the world, which chronologically follow the space race of the 1960s.

# THURSDAY, AUGUST 29<sup>TH</sup> TOUR DESCRIPTION

## Salina

Our 90-mile drive to Salina takes us to downtown Salina, KS where we will spend the day. First stop is the 40,000 sq ft “The Garage Automotive Museum.” In addition to an expansive collection of classic cars, the museum offers driving simulators, and hands-on welding and painting educational experiences. The current exhibit features cars of the “Fabulous 50’s.”

Lunch: A brisk walk leads you to Martinelli’s Little Italy Restaurant where we’ll enjoy an Italian buffet. Martinelli’s has been serving the Salina area since 2001. Don’t miss the local favorite Martinelli’s Chopped Salad.

After lunch, we will visit Richard Morrison’s car collection which is located behind the Stiefel Theatre across the street from Martinelli’s.

We will then return to our cars and drive 4 blocks away to Roger Morrison’s car collection. Roger Morrison is one of the founders of the “The Garage Automotive Museum,” and has graciously invited us to tour his collection of mainly Mercedes, Porsche, and muscle cars.

Had enough of cars? Our lunch location is in the heart of downtown, where you’ll find a unique shopping experience.

# FRIDAY, AUGUST 30<sup>TH</sup> TOUR DESCRIPTION

## Marquette - Lindsborg

Exit your four-wheelers and enter the world of the motorcycle. The Kansas Motorcycle Museum is located in the picturesque little town of Marquette. This jewel houses more than 100 bikes dating from the 1900's to the 1970's. Learn about Marquette racing legend Stan Engdahl and his 60-year racing career through historical photos and posters.

Lunch: Crown and Rye Restaurant Lindsborg Kansas enjoy an authentic Scandinavian buffet in the heart of Kansas.

Our after-lunch stop in Lindsborg is a tour of the Lindsborg Old Mill & Swedish Heritage Museum. The museum features a restored three-story-tall flour mill built in 1898. Also on the grounds is the Swedish Pavilion originally built in Sweden for the 1904 St. Louis World's Fair.

Need more time to get in touch with your Swedish roots? Well, you've made a good start. Now it's time to discover Lindsborg, aka Little Sweden USA. You may want to explore the delightful two-block stretch of brick streets housing galleries, coffee shops, specialty shops, and even a wine-tasting room.

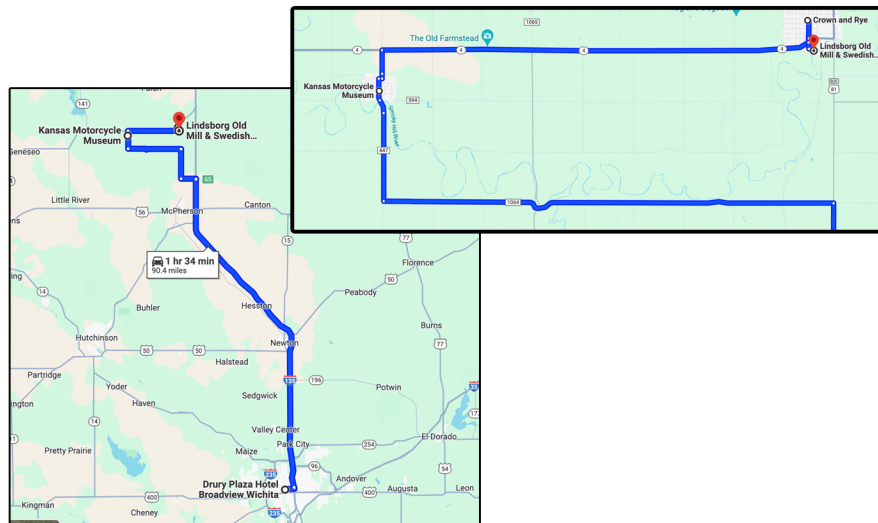

## Wichita

Ever wonder why Wichita is called the Air Capital? Kansas' largest city is home to many airplane manufacturers including Boeing, Airbus, and Cessna. We'll visit the Kansas Aviation Museum located in the original art deco 1935 WPA-built structure. This was once Wichita's Municipal Airport. Walk in the footsteps of Howard Hughes, and Amelia Earhart as you stroll past the many historic aircraft on display. Enter the control tower for a great view of the city and watch the air tankers take off at adjacent McConnell Air Force Base.

Farewell Lunch and Private Car Collection Tour. You didn't think we'd let you leave Kansas without a barbeque feast, and one more car collection, did you? Noted Wichita collector Ross DeVore has invited the Tour to view his collection which includes a '41 Cadillac, two Mirages, a Bicentennial Eldorado, a T-top Eldo, and many others.

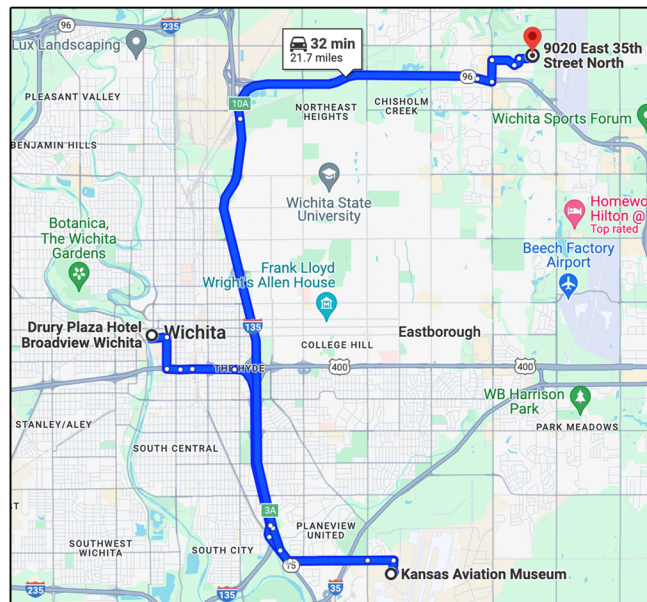

The Cadillac & LaSalle Club Touring Recognition Program was established to promote the maintenance, preservation, and driveability of our Cadillac-built automobiles. Recognition awards for eligible vehicles are special "Touring" grille badges. As vehicle miles accumulate over time, increased levels of achievement will be recognized.

### PROGRAM OUTLINE

- Level 1 achievement will be 500 miles during two or more qualifying touring events.
- Level 2 achievement will be 2,000 miles using same vehicle.
- This program began June 7, 2011, and is not retroactive.
- In-transit miles do not qualify.
- Cadillac and LaSalle vehicles must be

10 years old and older (by the calendar) to carry the Level 1 grille badge. Badges are not transferable to other vehicles.

- Vehicles less than 10 years old may accumulate miles, but will not receive a badge until they become 10 calendar years old.
- Qualifying touring events include the National Driving Tour, driving tours conducted during a Grand National or Cadillac Fall Festival, and pre-approved Regional touring events. (For Regional events to qualify, they must be at least 100 miles and two days in duration, open to all CLC members, and have been submitted to the National Meets and Tours Committee for inclusion.)
- Participants accrue program miles daily; full tour participation is not required.
- Miles accumulated for awards will

be the official daily miles from the tour, not actual miles. Regions sponsoring qualifying touring events will provide daily mileage figures to the National Meets and Tours Committee for this purpose.
